### Reminders

- The MA in East Asian Studies requires ten total graduate-level courses (30 semester hours) from at least two different programs or departments (cross-listed courses can satisfy this requirement) and a milestone project (MA thesis or two revised research papers)
- All MA in East Asian Studies students are required to demonstrate proficiency in an East Asian language equivalent to (or higher than) successful completion of the full 3rd-year language sequence at Duke

\*English for International Students courses are taken on a pass/fail basis and do not count towards degree requirements (they do count toward full-time enrollment for students on an F or J visa); students may need to take an additional course to fulfill degree requirements
