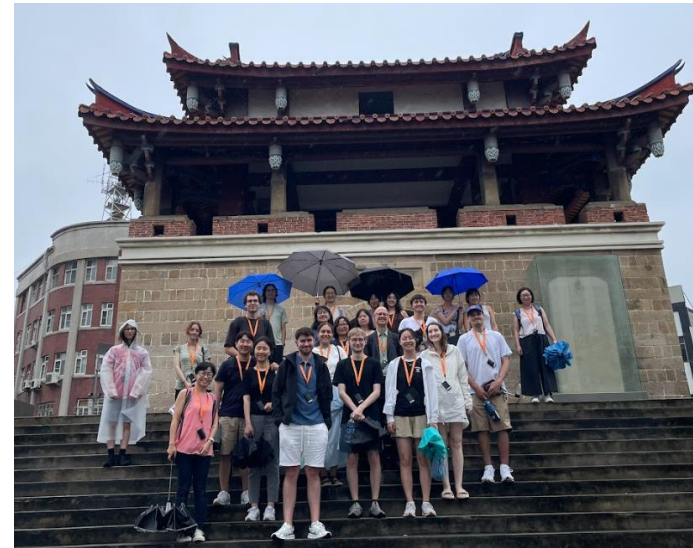
# **Activities & Workshops for this Summer**
